Fund manager's commentary

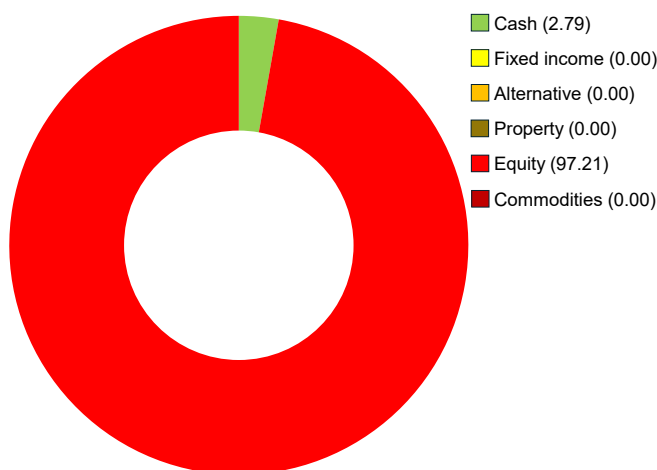
The Federal Reserve held its policy interest rate at 4.25-4.5% because of sticky inflation and steady economic growth and the dollar rose 3.55% against the pound. US technology stocks rose 9.12% in sterling as negotiations assuaged fears among investors that punitive tariffs would lead to recession. The EF Brompton Global Equity Fund's sole global holding, Polar Capital Global Technology outperformed, up 10.68%. US stocks outperformed, up 5.88% in sterling, but jobs data for July, released in August, disappointed, with just 73,000 non-farm jobs created and figures for May and June were downgraded. Within the portfolio, the iShares S&P 500 Equal Weight exchange-traded fund, up 4.52%, lagged because of its low weighting in the technology sector. Equities in Asia excluding Japan and emerging markets outperformed, up 6.28% and 5.64% respectively in sterling. Within the portfolio, Prusik Asian Equity Income and Redwheel Next Generation Emerging Markets Equity, which have relatively-low Chinese and Indian allocations, rose 9.52% and 6.92% respectively but Man Asia (ex-Japan) lagged, up 4.96%. UK equities lagged, up 3.83%, as did equities in Europe excluding the UK, up 0.96% in sterling. The portfolio's actively-managed UK holdings were even weaker because of underperformance among small stocks, with Artemis UK Special Situations and Man Income up only 0.76% and 0.77% respectively, but the Europe ex-UK holdings outperformed, with Lightman European strongest, up 2.70%. In Japan, were equities rose 2.54% in sterling, Nippon Active Value gained 5.50%. The EF Brompton Global Equity Fund rose 5.19% in July while the sector rose 4.52%.

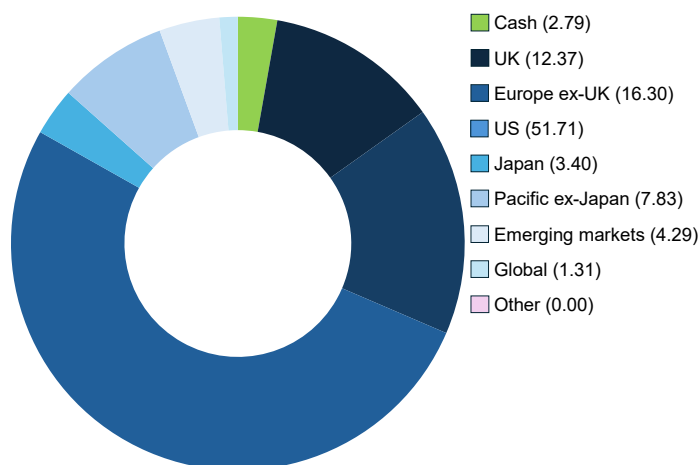

Investment policy

The Fund will typically invest a minimum of 80% of its net asset value in collective investment schemes, exchange traded funds and unregulated collective investment schemes. The Fund may also invest in investment trusts (and similar instruments), other transferable securities, money-market instruments, fixed income instruments, deposits and foreign exchange contracts.

Investments will not be confined by industrial, economic or geographical sector. The Fund may hold, on a temporary basis, all or part of its assets in cash or other ancillary liquid assets.

The Fund may utilise derivatives for the purposes of efficient portfolio management (typically hedging, including investing in hedged share classes, which attempts to mitigate against falls in the value of the Fund's assets and the effects of changes in currency exchange rates against the Fund's base currency, which is pounds sterling).

The Fund's benchmark is IA Global. This represents a comparator benchmark because the Fund's performance can be compared to funds which also sit within this industry sector.
