Fund manager's commentary

Stronger-than-anticipated economic data, including US non-farm payroll increases, may mean interest rates remain higher for longer. In response, global bonds and equities fell 1.69% and 1.19% respectively in sterling and the dollar rose 1.69% against the pound. Among the EF Brompton Global Equity Fund's global holdings, Polar Capital Global Technology outperformed, up 1.77%, but the iShares Gold Producers exchange-traded fund fell 12.26%, however, as bullion prices weakened. Equities in Asia excluding Japan and emerging markets fell 5.24% and 4.90% respectively in sterling in response to the dollar's rise and fears of tighter monetary policy. Within the portfolio, Vietnam Enterprise Investments and Redwheel Global Emerging Markets suffered most, down 11.89% and 6.78% respectively, but Goldman Sachs India Equity fell only 1.55% against a 2.92% fall in sterling for Indian equities. The UK economy grew 0.3% in January, beating expectations, and UK equities outperformed, up 1.75%, although small stocks gained only 1.15%. Within the portfolio, Man GLG Income and Liontrust Special Situations did best, up 2.65% and 1.94% respectively, but Chelverton UK Equity Growth, a small-stock specialist, fell 0.18%. Equities in Europe excluding the UK gained 0.81% in sterling and all three holdings outperformed, with Janus Henderson European Smaller Companies and Martin Currie European Unconstrained doing best, up 3.04% and 3.01% respectively. In Japan, where equities fell 2.00% in sterling, Lindsell Train Japanese Equity and Baillie Gifford Japanese Smaller Companies both lagged, down 4.93% and 3.67% respectively. 



Investment policy

The Fund will typically invest a minimum of 80% of its net asset value in collective investment schemes, exchange traded funds and unregulated collective investment schemes. The Fund may also invest in investment trusts (and similar instruments), other transferable securities, money-market instruments, fixed income instruments, deposits and foreign exchange contracts.

Investments will not be confined by industrial, economic or geographical sector. The Fund may hold, on a temporary basis, all or part of its assets in cash or other ancillary liquid assets.

The Fund may utilise derivatives for the purposes of efficient portfolio management (typically hedging, including investing in hedged share classes, which attempts to mitigate against falls in the value of the Fund's assets and the effects of changes in currency exchange rates against the Fund's base currency, which is pounds sterling).

The Fund's benchmark is IA Global. This represents a comparator benchmark because the Fund's performance can be compared to funds which also sit within this industry sector.
