All of the fund's expenses are charged to capital. This has had the effect of increasing the distributions paid on an annualised basis by approximately 0.90 percentage points on the B share class and reducing the capital performance by an equivalent amount.



Fund manager's commentary

UK equities gained 2.95%, outperforming the 0.95% gain in sterling from global equities as fears of a no-deal Brexit receded. With UK assets in demand among overseas investors, sterling rose 2.21% and 1.19% respectively against the euro and dollar. Amongst the EF Brompton Global Income Fund's investments in UK equity funds, Man GLG UK Income and Aberforth Split Level Income outperformed, rising 5.00% and 3.85% respectively, but Lindsell Train UK Equity, which typically invests in quality growth stocks, underperformed, down 0.34%. The portfolio's UK equity allocation increased by adding the iShares FTSE 250 exchange-traded fund, Majedie UK Income and Majedie Investments. Federal Open Markets Committee minutes revealed the decision to cut rates in September was not unanimous, with two of the 10 members voting to leave rates unchanged. Global bonds fell 2.18% in sterling as expectations of further US interest rate cuts decreased. UK government bonds and sterling corporate bonds returned 0.50% and 0.03% respectively but Artemis Strategic Bond and Henderson Fixed Interest Monthly Income lagged, down 0.24% and 0.10% respectively. The three funds within the global equity allocation outperformed, with Legg Mason Global Infrastructure and BlackRock World Mining doing best, up 1.63% and 1.42% respectively. The portfolio's alternative holding, 3i Infrastructure, fell 1.17%. The portfolio's best performer was JP Morgan Russian Securities, which gained 6.24%, outperforming the 2.41% gain in sterling by the Russian stockmarket. The EF Brompton Global Income Fund rose 0.59%† in September while the sector gained 0.77%. At 30 September, the historic yield was 3.25%††. 



Investment policy

The Fund will typically invest a minimum of 80% of its net asset value in collective investment schemes, exchange traded funds and unregulated collective investment schemes.

The Fund may also invest in investment trusts (and similar instruments), other transferable securities, money-market instruments, fixed income instruments, deposits and foreign exchange contracts.

It is expected that exposure to equity markets will typically range from a minimum of 20% to a maximum of 60% of the total Fund, with the aim of achieving the Fund's objective. However, investments will not be confined by industrial, economic or geographical sector.

The Fund may also hold, on a temporary basis, all or part of its assets in cash or other ancillary liquid assets.

The Fund may utilise derivatives for the purposes of efficient portfolio management (typically hedging, including investing in hedged share classes, which attempts to mitigate against falls in the value of the Fund's assets and the effects of changes in currency exchange rates against the Fund's base currency, which is pounds sterling).

The Fund's benchmark is IA Mixed Investment 20-60% Shares. This represents a comparator benchmark because the Fund's performance can be compared to funds which also sit within this industry sector.
