All of the fund's expenses are charged to capital. This has had the effect of increasing the distributions paid on an annualised basis by approximately 0.90 percentage points on the B share class and reducing the capital performance by an equivalent amount.

Fund manager's commentary

Currency movements contributed to gains for global equities and bonds of 2.88% and 0.22% respectively in sterling as the pound fell 1.81% against the dollar. Two of the EF Brompton Global Income Fund's three global equity holdings outperformed, with M&G Global Dividend and Newton Global Income returning 5.07% and 3.27% respectively. The pound weakened as inflation fell in March for the second consecutive month and figures showed a first-quarter economic growth slowdown. Investors concluded an early Bank of England base rate rise was less likely although weather-related weakness in economic data may prove transitory. UK equities outperformed, rising 6.77%. The portfolio's UK equity fund allocation increased through an addition to Schroder Income, which was the portfolio's best performer, rising 7.92%, but the Aberforth Split Level Income investment trust lagged, dropping 3.02%. Equities in Europe excluding the UK also did well, rising 4.11% in sterling and the WisdomTree Europe SmallCap Dividend exchange-traded fund, marginally outperformed, rising 4.22%. Oil prices rose 7.78% in sterling as Middle East political risks increased following US military intervention in Syria and growing expectations that President Trump would not endorse the Iran nuclear accord. Sterling hedging helped GLG Japan CoreAlpha, which returned 6.05%, outperforming the 2.50% gain for Japanese equities in sterling. Sterling hedging contributed, however, to the 1.12% fall by Templeton Emerging Markets Bond but Artemis Strategic Bond returned 0.65%. The EF Brompton Global Income Fund rose 2.48%† in April while the sector rose 2.23%. At 30 April, the historic yield was 3.57%††.




