Fund manager's commentary

The Federal Reserve and European Central Bank raised their policy interest rates by three-quarters of a percentage point while the Bank of England raised its rate half a point. Global equities and bonds fell 5.70% and 1.12% respectively in sterling. Of the WAY Flexible Global Growth Portfolio's significant global equity holdings, the best performers were the iShares Gold Producers exchange-traded fund (ETF), up 3.17% as gold rose 1.23% in sterling, and Polar Capital Global Insurance, down 1.52%. Polar Capital Global Technology underperformed, falling 8.13%. The UK government's mini-budget announcement of unfunded tax cuts forced the BoE to abandon plans to sell bonds for now and launch bond purchases of up to £65 billion to ensure financial stability. Sterling fell 4.06% against the dollar. UK government bonds, investment-grade sterling corporate and sterling high-yield bonds fell 8.83%, 8.75% and 6.69% respectively. Within the portfolio, the sterling-hedged RWC Asia Convertibles investment fell 3.55%. UK stocks fell 5.87% and smaller companies lagged, down 7.97% because of their sensitivity to domestic trends. Within the portfolio, Liontrust Special Situations was relatively resilient, down 4.84%. Japanese equities fell 5.65% in sterling but Lindsell Train Japanese Equity bucked the trend, up 0.42%. In Asia excluding Japan, where equities fell 9.03% in sterling, Baillie Gifford Pacific lagged, falling 9.88% while Schroder Asian Total Return fell 6.18%. Among the alternative holdings, BlackRock European Absolute Alpha rose 1.55% but Man GLG UK Absolute Value fell 1.12%. The WAY Flexible Global Growth Portfolio fell 3.14% in September while the sector fell 4.65%.





Investment objective & policy

The objective of the Fund is to provide maximum capital growth.

The Fund will seek to achieve its objective from an actively managed and diversified portfolio of collective investment schemes (including investment trusts) with exposure to underlying assets such as equities, bonds, money market instruments, property and commodities. The Investment Adviser will not be constrained by underlying asset type or geographical split of the Fund's portfolio. The Fund may be invested up to 100% in schemes investing in equity securities, in appropriate market conditions.

The use of derivatives is not permitted but borrowing of up to 10% of the Fund's net asset value will be permitted on a temporary basis. The Fund may invest in hedged share classes of underlying funds.

Although the Fund will normally remain fully invested, the property of the Fund may consist of up to 10% cash or near cash where this may be reasonably regarded as necessary in order to enable the pursuit of the Fund's objective, settlement of redemptions of units and the efficient management of the Fund in accordance with its objectives or other purposes which may be reasonably regarded as ancillary to the objectives of the Fund.

The Fund's benchmark is IA Flexible Investment. This represents a comparator benchmark because the Fund's performance can be compared to funds which also sit within this industry sector.
