Fund manager's commentary

The Federal Reserve and European Central Bank raised their policy interest rates by three-quarters of a percentage point while the Bank of England raised its rate by half a point. Global equities and bonds fell 5.70% and 1.12% respectively in sterling. Of the WAY Global Growth Portfolio's significant global equity holdings, the best performers were the iShares Gold Producers exchange-traded fund (ETF), up 3.17% as gold rose 1.23% in sterling, and Polar Capital Global Insurance, down 1.52%. Polar Capital Global Technology and First Sentier Global Listed Infrastructure underperformed, falling 8.13% and 6.90% respectively. The Xtrackers MSCI World Energy ETF was sold. The UK government's mini-budget announcement of unfunded tax cuts forced the BoE to abandon plans to sell bonds for now and launch bond purchases of up to £65 billion to ensure financial stability. Sterling fell 4.06% against the dollar. UK government bonds, investment-grade sterling corporate and sterling high-yield bonds fell 8.83%, 8.75% and 6.69% respectively. Within the portfolio, Schroder Strategic Credit fell 4.13%. UK stocks fell 5.87% and smaller companies lagged, down 7.97% because of their higher sensitivity to domestic trends. Within the portfolio, Man GLG Undervalued Assets fell 7.97% but Lindsell Train UK Equity fell only 2.48%. In Asia excluding Japan, where equities fell 9.03% in sterling, Baillie Gifford Pacific and Schroder Asian Total Return fell 9.88% and 6.18% respectively. Among the alternative holdings, BlackRock European Absolute Alpha rose 1.55% but Trojan fell 2.38%. The WAY Global Growth Portfolio fell 2.93%† in September while the sector fell 5.22%.

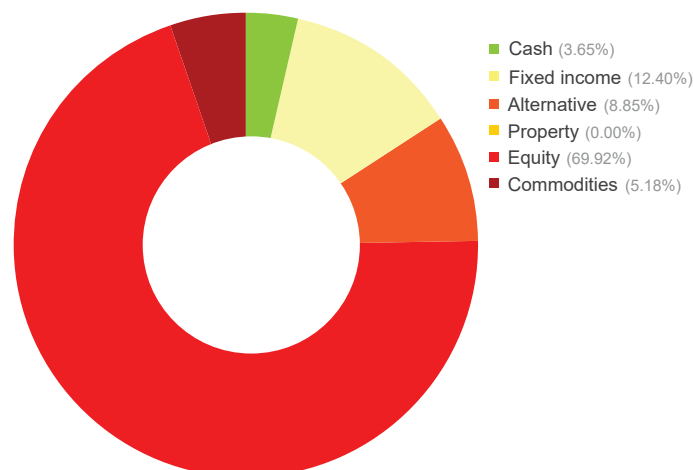

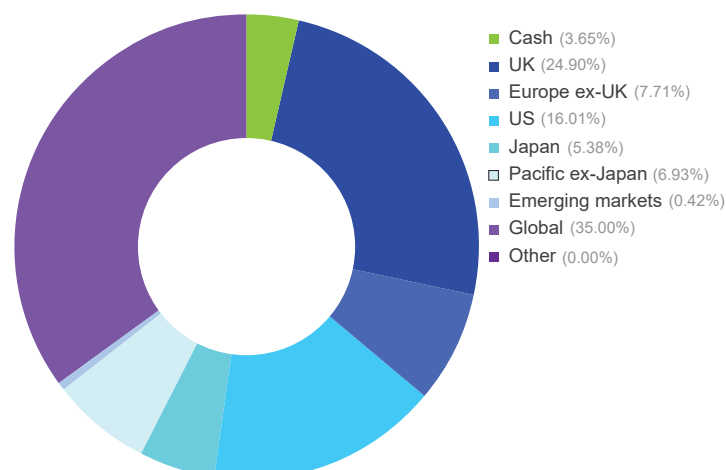

Investment objective & policy

The objective of the Fund is to seek a high level of capital growth over a period of at least 5 years.

The Fund will seek to achieve its objective from an actively managed portfolio of collective investment schemes, investment trusts, other transferable securities, cash or near cash, deposits and money market instruments. The Fund will typically invest between 40% and 85% of its portfolio in equity securities.

There will be no restrictions on the underlying content of the investments held, in terms of investment type, geographical or economic sector.

The use of derivatives and/or hedging transactions will be permitted in connection with the efficient portfolio management of the Fund (typically hedging, which attempts to mitigate against falls in the value of the Fund's assets and the effects of changes in currency exchange rates against the Fund's base currency, which is pounds sterling). Borrowing of up to 10% of the Fund's net asset value will be permitted.

On giving 60 days notice to Shareholders, the Fund may, in addition to its other investment powers, use derivatives and forward transactions for investment purposes. It is not intended that the use of derivatives in this way will change the risk profile of the Fund.

Subject to the above, the Fund may invest in any asset class and adopt any investment technique or strategy permitted under the rules in COLL as such rules are applied to Non-UCITS retail schemes.

The Fund's benchmark is IA Mixed investment 40-85% shares. This represents a comparator benchmark because the Fund's performance can be compared to funds which also sit within this industry sector.
